ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL STUDENTS

Junior Research Exhibition (JREX)

All CCHS graduates must complete a multi-disciplinary research exhibition in the junior year that requires them to effectively articulate a well-researched and scholarly argument in an area of passion. Students must produce a paper of 10-15 pages using media, multiple sources, as well as personal interviews and present their work in a polished presentation before a panel of faculty and experts.

Leadership Program

The co-curricular CCHS Leadership Program centers around our Core Values—courage, wisdom, justice, and charity—anchored in a spiritual, ethical, and moral life. Leadership events include student retreats, service days, wilderness adventures, and mission trips—supported by training in outdoor skills and first aid.

Tier 1 participation is required of all CCHS students. Requires an annual leadership camp each August and a week of community service each October, which result in 1 credit of Leadership Skills Development, typically awarded junior year.

Tier 2 is open for students who want to develop further as leaders. Additional requirements include at least two Winter Expeditions (week-long service trips), two Vision Quests (two nights of solo camping and spiritual reflection), and at least one mission trip (typically eight days in Panama and/or the Navajo Nation), which may qualify students for 1 credit of Engaged Citizenship, awarded senior year.

Tier 3 requires that students undergo a rigorous, 3-stage tryout process to become one of our elite servants known as Senior Leaders. They receive advanced training in wilderness first aid and CPR, wilderness survival, and leading and organizing small teams. They must attend all Senior Leader training events and are held to the highest standards of responsibility, spirituality, and integrity.

Rigor

Anecdotal feedback indicates that many of our classes are significantly more demanding than public school classes of the same "level," particularly our honors classes. Since we don't offer many AP or DE options, our honors classes are often the highest rigor available and are taught as such. For example, our honors chemistry class (taken sophomore year) covers many topics at an introductory college level, something confirmed by recent graduates attending University of Florida and other respected universities.

Course of study

Due to our small size, students are very limited in which courses they can take. All students are required to take Philosophy, Spanish, Speech, and Anatomy, for example. They only have two opportunities to take true electives, which must be online through FLVS: their 10th grade elective and senior year if not taking Spanish IV.
